1 | PLAN

Every great project starts with preparation. Bring some initial measurements from existing countertops or cabinet plans, and gather samples of your cabinet color, your flooring, etc.



2 | SCHEDULE YOUR APPOINTMENT

You'll meet with an expert who will guide you through material options, performance, and maintenance. We'll also review finishes and edge profiles to ensure your selections fit both your style and lifestyle.



3 | SELECT YOUR STONE

You'll tour our slab warehouse to view full slabs in person and appreciate each stone's natural character. This is also the time to select sinks, faucets, and other accessories to complete your project.



4 | PLACE YOUR ORDER

Once selections are finalized, a deposit secures your materials and installation date. Having all sinks, faucets, and appliances on site by templating helps ensure a smooth process.



5 | TEMPLATING

Our technician creates a precise digital template of your space using laser technology in a 1-2 hour visit. We'll review all measurements and final details with you to ensure complete accuracy.



6 | 3D LAYOUT *(optional)*

An optional 3D layout shows exactly how your slabs will be cut, including seams and vein flow. You can review the layout digitally or in person to fine-tune details before fabrication begins.



7 | FABRICATION

Your slabs are expertly cut, shaped, and polished in-house using a blend of skilled craftsmanship and advanced machinery. Each piece is inspected at multiple stages to ensure it matches the template and meets our quality standards.



8 | INSTALLATION

Our team carefully removes existing countertops if needed and installs your new surfaces with precision and care. We'll review maintenance tips and ensure you're completely satisfied with the finished result.
